ELECTIVES AND ALTERNATE ELECTIVES

- In the upper left corner of your screen in X2, click on “entry mode”. In “Primary Requests” you will enter the courses you wish to take so that your total number of credits listed at the top of the screen equals 70. You must sign up for a Math class and an English class, as there are many 12th grade courses to choose from. Please choose one primary English course, and two other backups (in case your first choice fills up). You should check your graduation progress to make sure you are selecting the courses you need. You can view this in X2 - top tab “My Info”, side tab “Transcripts”, sub side tab “Grade Point Summary”. Choose carefully. The choices are grouped into subject areas in X2. Check off the primary courses you’d like to take. Then select up to **six more** alternate electives (in case you don’t get your primary choices). Please rank these according to your preference – 1 for top choice, 2, etc...up to 6.
- Once your total credits for primary requests equals 70 credits, and you’ve entered 6 alternate electives (in case you don’t get your first choice), click “Post” at the bottom of the page.
- Be sure to read through the Program of Studies (on the CHS website) and talk to your teachers, counselor, and family to inform you and support you in making coursework decisions that are most appropriate for you, keeping in mind your anticipated school and activity schedule for the next year.

Scheduling Instructions for Grade 11 High School Students

Must be completed by March 16, 2017

- X2 course requests can be entered in the **Student Portal ONLY**. The X2 portal will be open for students to view their course recommendations and choose electives from March 3-16, however, you can view your recommendations now.
- Students, log into your X2 Aspen account by visiting <http://chelmsford.k12.ma.us/chs>. Click on the "Student" tab followed by "X2". Use your "Login ID" and "Password" to access your account.
- Students, if you forget your login info, under the student tab, select "Password Reset Request". A member of the tech office will respond within 12-24 hours. Do not submit for a reset more than once.

RECOMMENDED COURSES

- Once you are logged into X2 click on "My Info", and the side tab "Requests", you will then see the courses for which you have been recommended. Using the list below, check off the courses for which you have been recommended. Due to graduation requirements, you should only have recommendations for mathematics courses, support classes, and any other AP or Honors class you might be interested in. If you disagree with a teacher recommendation and are looking to override into a course at a different level, put an 'O' in the box next to the course. If you are not interested in pursuing the honors or AP course for which you have been recommended, simply place an "X" in the box for the course you were recommended. Save this information for later.
- If you wish to change the level of the recommended course, have a conversation with your teacher first, then...
 - If you want to move down a level or you do not wish to take the course that is recommended for you write a note in the "Notes" section at the bottom of the X2 page
 - If you want to move up a level, you must follow the override process (see below).
- If you wish to select a course that your teacher does not recommend due to ineligibility, you must complete the override process. **Override Forms** explain in detail the process and are **due by March 16th** in order to potentially enroll in that course. Teachers and counselors will have forms available upon request while the portal is open. **Any form submitted after March 16th will not be considered. BE AWARE** if you wish to override into a math AP or Honors 1 class, you must take a test on March 27th. **BE AWARE** if you wish to override into an English and/or history AP or Honors 1 class, you must take a test on March 28th.
